The First-ever Mobile HPV Testing & Treatment Clinic

No woman should die of cervical cancer.

Cervical cancer is nearly 100% preventable and highly curable if detected and treated early.

Yet, every 2 minutes cervical cancer claims another woman's life.

Few diseases demonstrate global inequities like cervical cancer. In 2020, an estimated 342,000 women lost their lives to this preventable disease and there were an estimated 570,000 new cases. An astounding **90%** of deaths from cervical cancer occur in low- and middle-income countries affecting the world's most vulnerable women. Women who are dying a painful and undignified death simply because they lack access to basic preventative care.

Without an urgent and wide scale intervention, deaths from cervical cancer are predicted to increase more than 30% by 2040. The World Health Organization is calling on the global community to eliminate cervical cancer by focusing our resources and efforts on prevention. Now is the time to deploy innovative, effective, and scalable solutions to make cervical cancer a disease of the past.

CureCervicalCancer's **innovative and holistic** model brings the most effective tools for identifying and treating cervical cancer to women in the hardest to reach places who have no other access to care. Women may never have the opportunity to visit a healthcare facility which offers screening and treatment so we bring screening and treatment to them.

Together, we can eliminate cervical cancer.

We identify the highest need regions around the globe and establish permanent cervical cancer prevention clinics - both mobile and facility-based.

EDUCATE



We conduct specialized training for local healthcare professionals and community health workers, so that they can continue to provide life-saving services to the women in their communities.

EMPOWER



We aim to achieve sustainability by building local capacity and optimizing existing resources. We partner with national/local governments and organizations to strengthen healthcare systems and improve access to care.

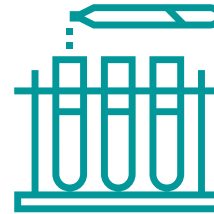




Mobile HPV Testing & Treatment Program

Our Mobile HPV Testing & Treatment Program brings free HPV tests directly to the doorstep of women in the community through trained Community Health Volunteers. The HPV tests are processed in our mobile laboratory which operates on solar batteries and can travel anywhere. Women who test HPV-positive are invited to receive free thermal ablation treatment at mobile treatment clinics from a team of local healthcare providers. Women who require advanced care are assigned to our social worker who links them with a referral hospital.

TEST



Human papillomavirus (HPV) testing detects high-risk HPV, which causes over >99% of cervical cancer. Our Mobile HPV Testing + Treatment Program brings self-sample HPV tests to women and accurately identifies who carries the highest risk of developing cervical cancer.

TREAT



We offer thermal ablation treatment to all eligible women to prevent cervical cancer from developing. With our mobile clinic and team of local healthcare providers, we can bring treatment anywhere, even to the most remote regions of the world.

LINK



Women requiring advanced care are linked to healthcare facilities. Our trained social worker and community health workers navigate women to access higher care.

What an exciting year it has been at CureCervicalCancer. Just one year after launching our first of its kind, Mobile HPV Testing & Treatment Program, we exceeded our goal by testing 11,384 women for high-risk HPV. Using a targeted and community-based approach, we are able to reach women who have no other access to screening with the most advanced method (HPV testing) for identifying those who are at risk of developing cervical cancer. Our mobile laboratory and team of healthcare providers travel into remote villages or we bring HPV tests directly to the doorsteps of women through Community Health Workers.



Yet, our program brings so much more than just screening and treatment.

We are strengthening the healthcare system by training and mentoring hundreds of healthcare professionals, lab technologists, and community health workers. We are educating thousands of men and women and community leaders about cervical cancer prevention and reproductive healthcare. We are changing lives by linking women with advanced disease to vital resources and treatment.

Thanks to your support, our Mobile HPV Testing & Treatment Program continues to grow, and we now have a full-time team of 5 Kenyan staff who oversee the daily program activities.

As we prepare for the upcoming year, we look forward to scaling our program to new regions of Kenya and beyond. Your continued support means the world to us and to the women around the world who deserve access to life-saving preventative care.

Vital Linkages: Navigating Women to Advanced Care Saves Lives

Millcent's Story

When Millcent came to one of the first HPV Testing & Treatment Mobile Clinic outreaches in Kenya, she needed care beyond what our team could provide. Her exam revealed suspected invasive cervical cancer, which a biopsy soon confirmed to be stage IIB. As a 45 year old wife and mother living on an income of a few dollars a day from informal labor, navigating the complex and costly path to cancer treatment was overwhelmingly scary for Millcent. But she was not alone on this journey - our Mobile Health for Mamas Client Champion, Millie, supported her each step of the way, linking her with the financial and psychosocial support she needed to access life-saving treatment. Thanks to these vital linkages, Millcent has recently completed her first round of chemotherapy and is expected to make a full recovery.

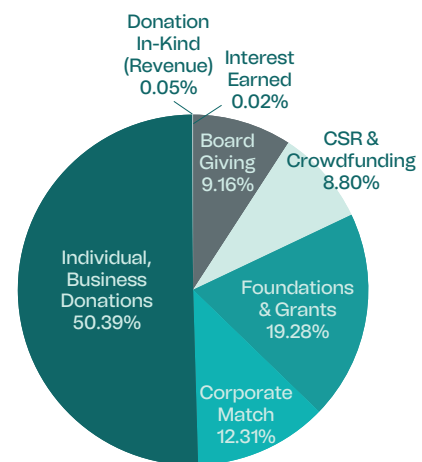

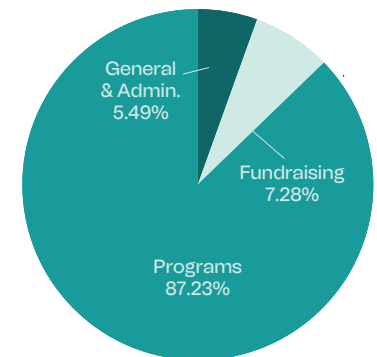
